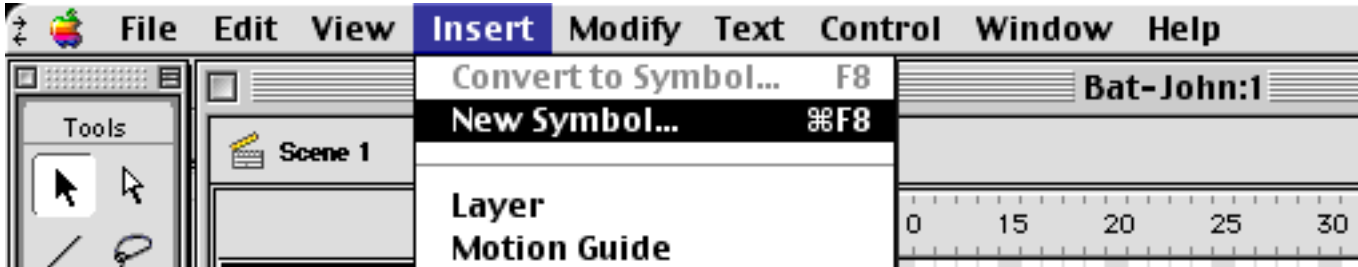
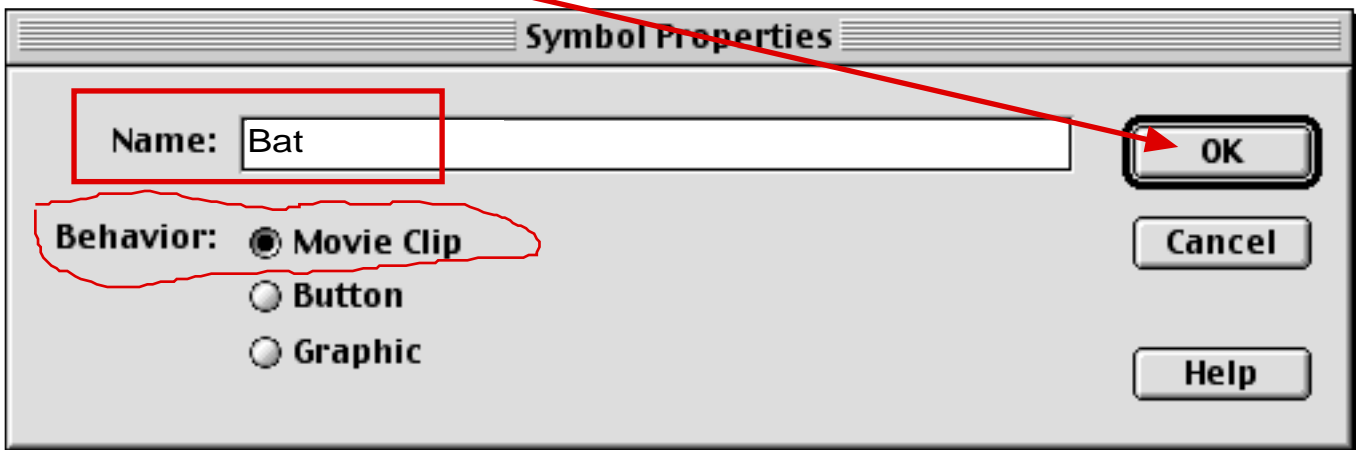


# Flying a Bat 3 - The Bat Flap

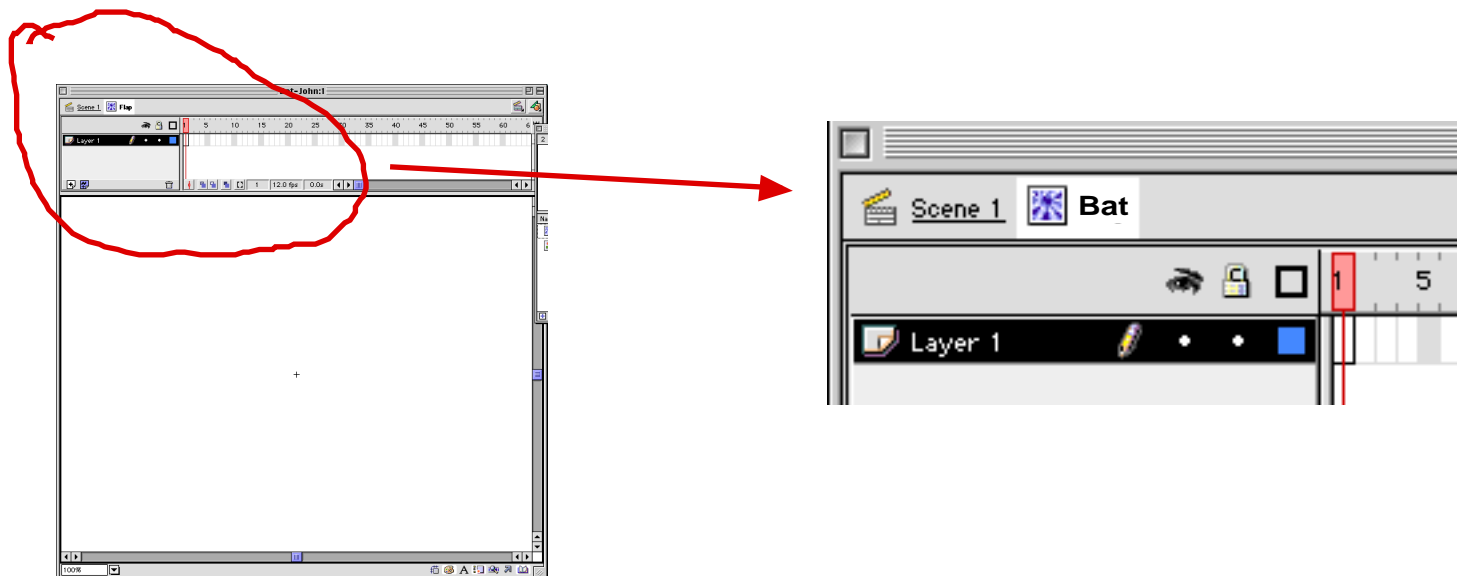
Open your file **Bat- YourName** on the desktop.  
Choose **New Symbol** from the **Insert** Menu

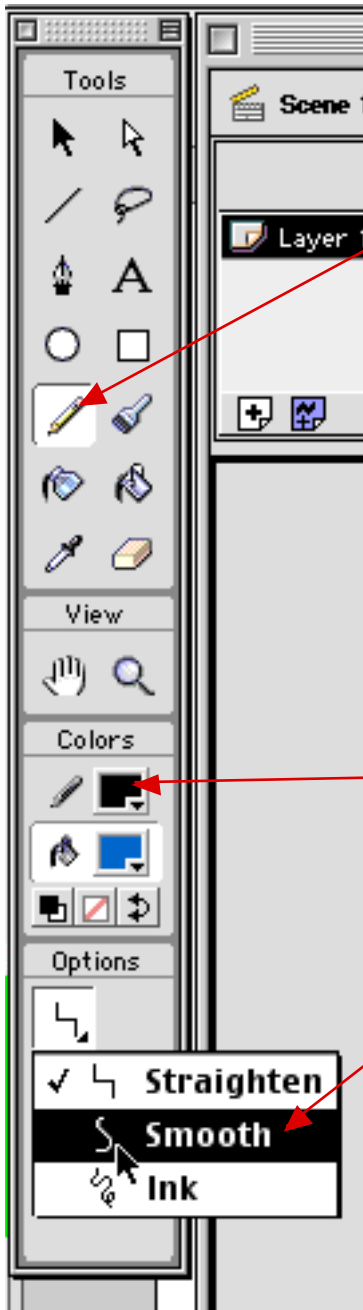


Do this, and click **OK**



Flash lets you edit your movie clip:



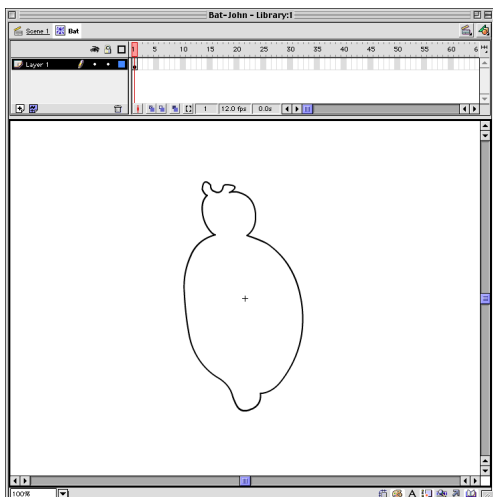
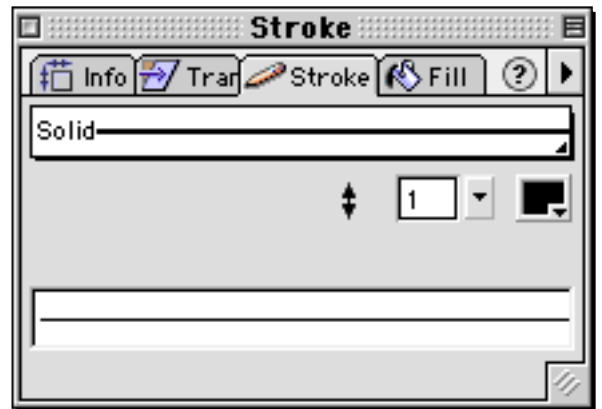


Click on the Pencil Tool tool on the Tool Palette

Make sure the pen colour is black

And Choose Smooth from the Options popup

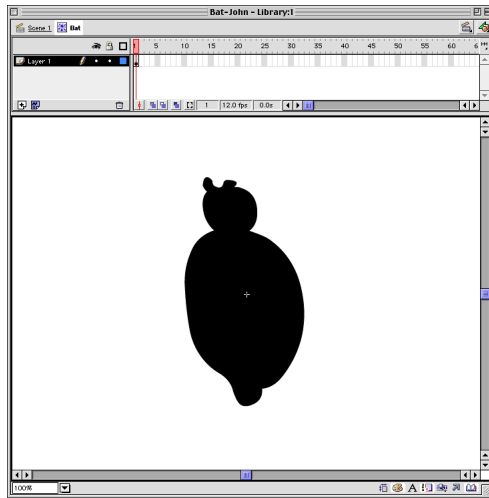
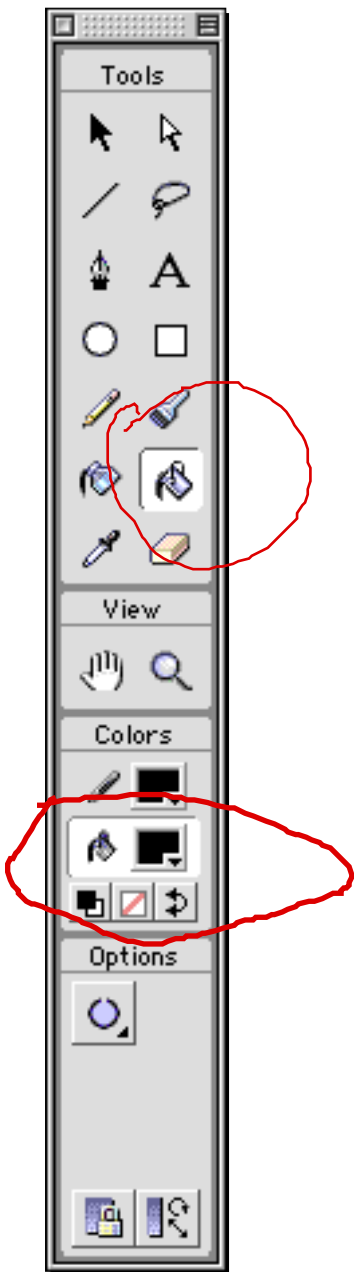
You could chose a thicker line from the Stroke panel if you like:



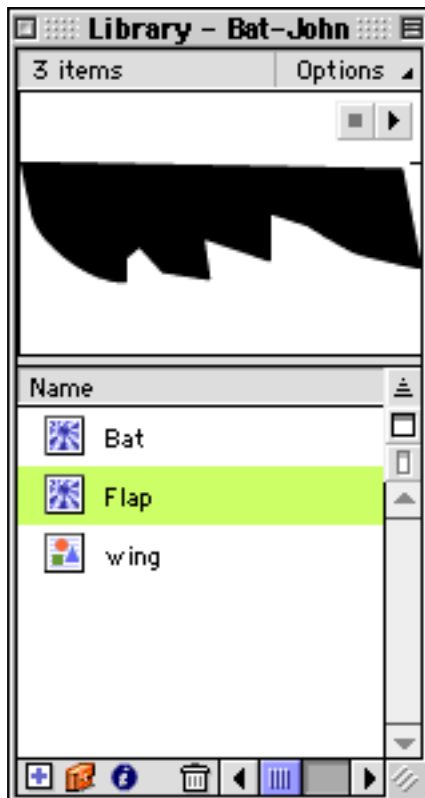
Draw a bat

To open the Stroke Panel  
**WindowsMenu>**  
**Panel> Stroke**

Fill it in

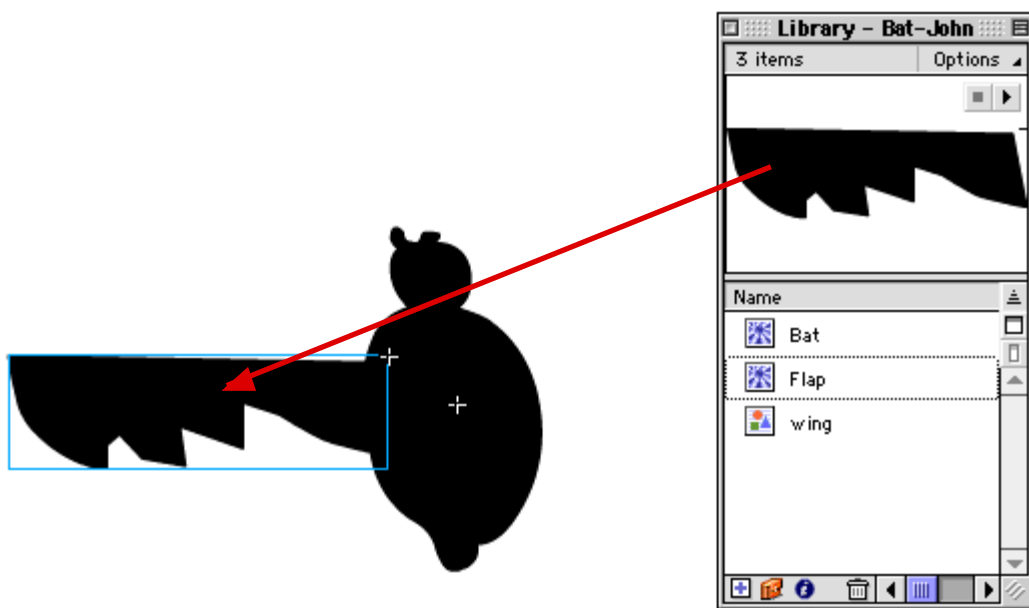


Open the library  
and click on the flap

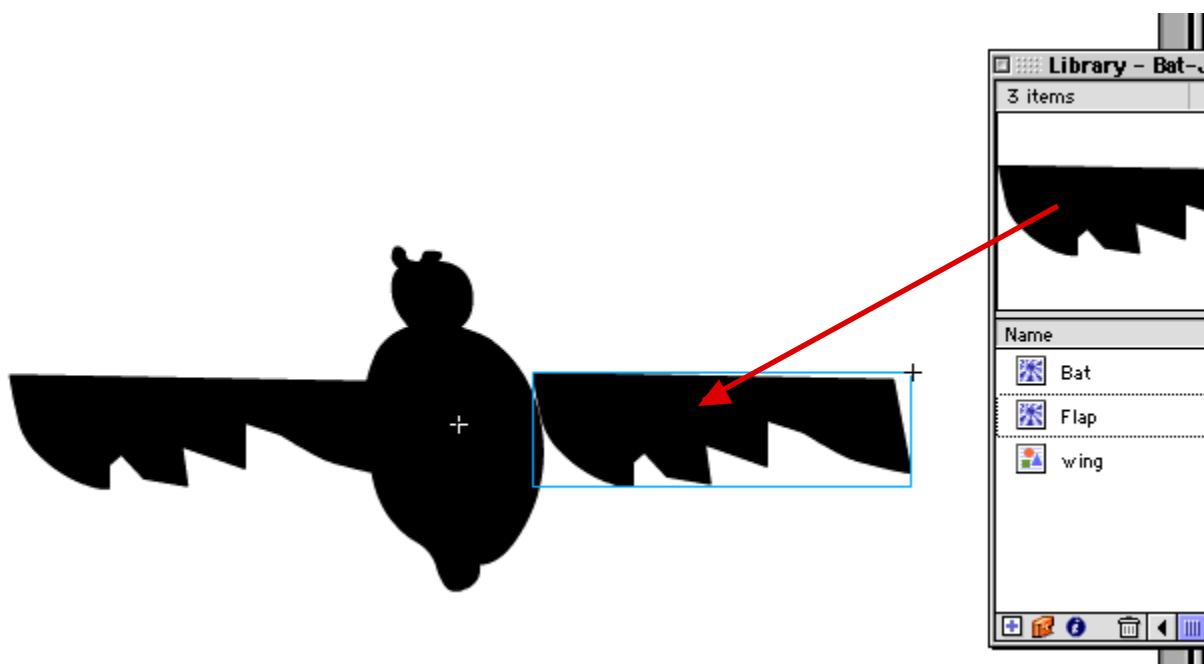


Drag the Flap on to the stage

Drag the Flap on to the stage



Drag another Flap on to the stage

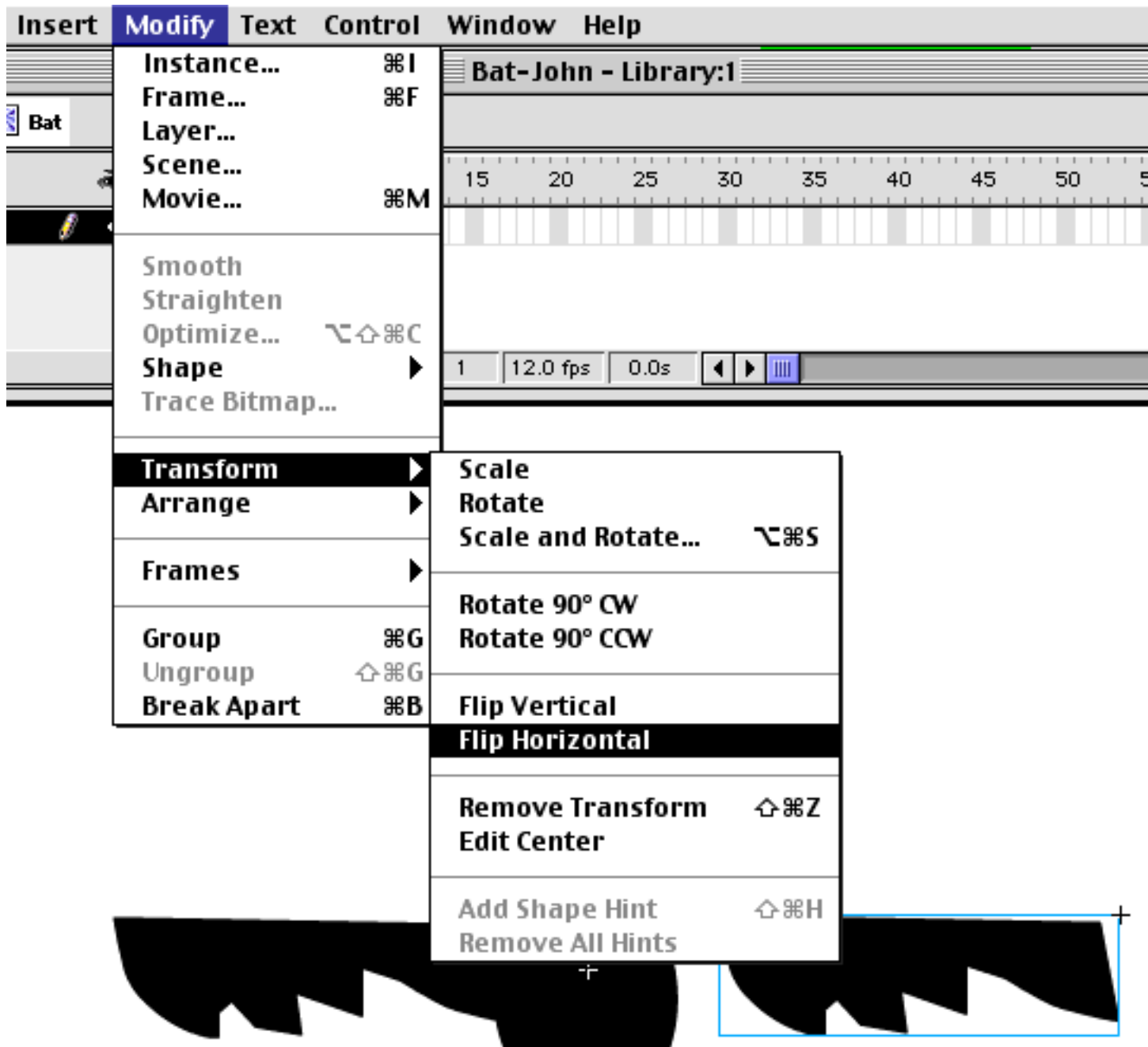


It is the wrong way round

go to page 5 to see how to turn it round

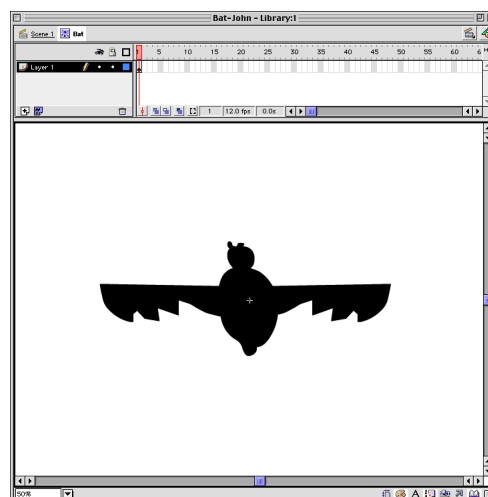

Do this:

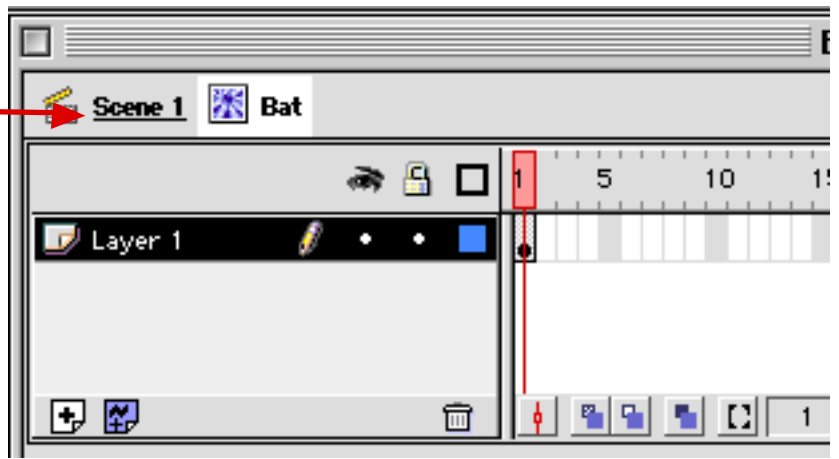


And the Flap Movie Clip turns round  
move both Flap clips against the body

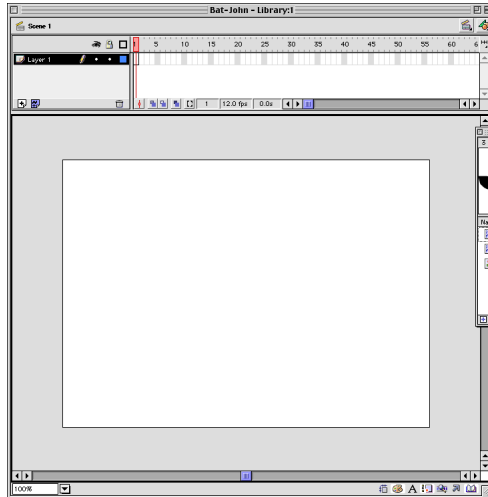

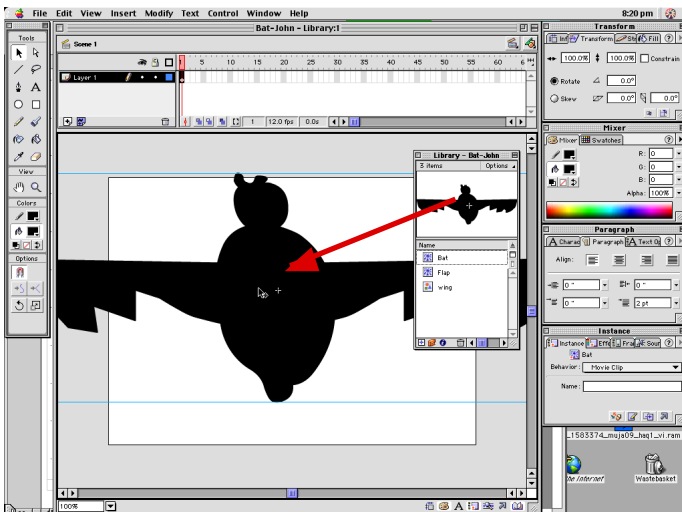
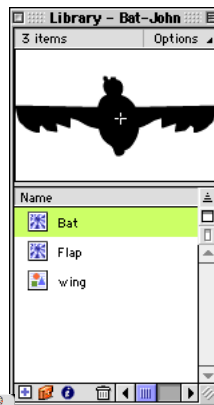
Click on Scene 1 at the top left of the window



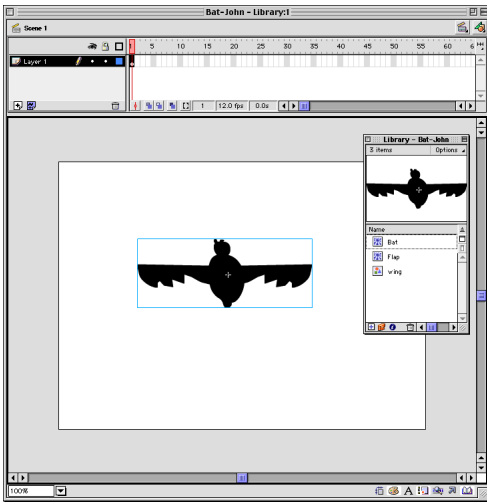
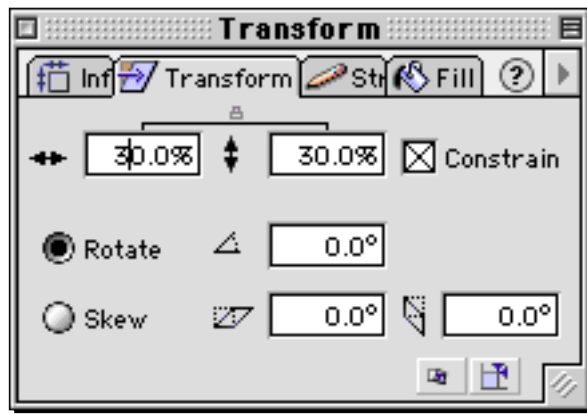
You will see a blank stage:



Select the Bat clip in the library and drag it onto the stage.



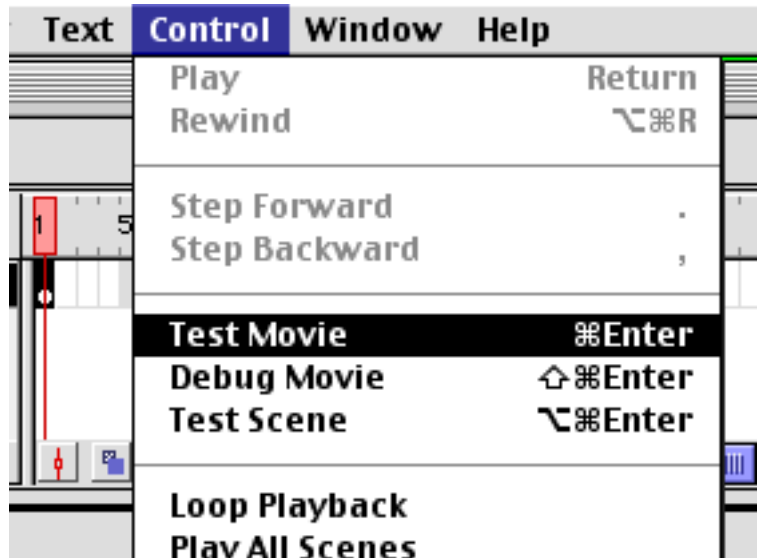
You might need to scale your bat in the transform panel.
